

Largest Cervical Cancer Awareness Lesson Report

Women empowerment and development have become crucial for the progress and growth of any society. Women play an essential role in shaping the future of any nation, and it is crucial to empower them with the right tools and resources to reach their full potential. As a part of this initiative, Vignan's University has established the "Women Empowerment and Development Cell(WEDC) ". On 18th March 2022, the largest cervical cancer awareness campaign was organized by Vignan's University in collaboration with the Grace Cancer Foundation and Collective Power of One International (CPIO) was a huge success. The event broke the Guinness World Record for the Largest Cervical Cancer awareness programme, held for more than 3,465 women. The programme was attended by several renowned medical professionals, who spoke about the importance of early detection of cervical cancer and the need for awareness programmes to spread knowledge about cancer and its prevention. The event was informative, engaging and served as a platform for attendees to interact with medical professionals and learn more about cancer and its treatment.

The program was held in the convocation hall of the university, well-arranged with chairs set up in a neat and orderly manner. It was a well-planned and well-executed event. The stage was set up at one end of the hall, which was adorned with flowers and banners displaying the logos of the participating organisations. The organisers had taken great care in ensuring the comfort of the participants. Clusters of chairs were arranged in the hall to bifurcate the 50 students who attended the program. Each cluster had one faculty member called a Steward who assisted the participants and guided them throughout the program. The stewards were given specific instructions on how to help the participants with any queries they may have and other details.

To ensure that the program was effective or not, the organisers had set up pre and post-feedback surveys. The surveys were designed to accurately assess the number of women who attended the program and to evaluate the effectiveness of the program in increasing their knowledge and awareness of cervical cancer. The surveys were made available to the participants both before and after the program, and the results were collated and analysed. The organisers TANA Foundation also provided T-shirts for the women participants, volunteers, coordinators and stewards who attended the program which is known for its philanthropic activities and as a token of appreciation for attending the program.

The event began with a prayer song by Veena Sri, which set the tone for the event's purpose and message. The event's program schedule was well-organized, with different sessions that covered various aspects of cervical cancer awareness. The event began with an introduction of the guests and the lighting of the lamp, which is a traditional Indian ritual that symbolizes the removal of darkness and the spread of light. The Vice-Chancellor, Dr. P. Nagabhushan, then addressed the audience, emphasizing the importance of cervical cancer awareness and the need for women's empowerment. The event's key personalities, Vice-Chairman Mr. L. Sri Krishna Devarayalu and Chairman Dr. L. Rathaiah, also addressed the audience and reiterated the importance of women's empowerment and their role in society's progress.

After the Vice-Chancellor's address, a pre-session survey was conducted to gauge the audience's knowledge and awareness of cervical cancer. The survey results were then used to tailor the awareness session to address the specific needs of the audience. The session was conducted by Dr. Chinnababu and Dr. Sujatha, who are experts in the field of cervical cancer. They provided valuable information on cervical cancer, its causes, symptoms, prevention, and treatment.

Dr. Chinnababu Sunkavalli, a renowned robotic surgical oncologist, emphasized the lack of awareness around cervical cancer screening and its life-saving potential. He informed the audience that approximately 71,000 Indian women die from cervical cancer annually, and this number could rise to millions without widespread screening. Simple screening methods such as mammography, oral examination, and pap smear tests, could aid in early detection, he said. During the event, he delivered an awareness session on cervical cancer, focusing on its causes, symptoms, and preventive measures. He emphasized the importance of regular screening and early detection for successful treatment outcomes.

Dr. Venkata Sujatha Vellanki, a fertility specialist based in Hyderabad, was also present at the event. She shared her insights on the impact of cervical cancer on fertility and emphasized the importance of early detection and treatment to prevent adverse reproductive outcomes.

Following the awareness session, Dr. Sathya and Dr. Climie gave a talk on the importance of regular check-ups and screening for cervical cancer. They emphasized the need for early detection and the role of healthcare professionals in ensuring women's health and wellbeing.

Dr. Satya S. Kalangi, the founder and CEO of CPIO, spoke about the importance of awareness programmes in spreading knowledge about cervical cancer and its prevention. He said that CPIO is dedicated to spreading awareness about cancer in various parts of the world and is committed to providing cancer patients with the best treatment possible.

Dr. Dale Climie, a fertility specialist and board member of CPIO, spoke about the importance of fertility preservation in cancer patients. He informed the audience that chemotherapy and radiation therapy can affect a patient's fertility and emphasized the need for fertility preservation before starting cancer treatment, also shared his expertise on cancer prevention and treatment. He highlighted the importance of research and innovation in cancer care and encouraged participants to support and advocate for cancer research initiatives.

Other notable guests included Mr. Vidyadhar Garapati, Trustee, TANA Foundation, USA addressed the audience and stressed the importance of raising awareness about cervical cancer and supporting initiatives aimed at preventing and treating the disease. Dr. N. Jalaja, Associate Professor in the Department of Biotechnology and Secretary of WEDC at VFSTR, and Dr. K. Rajyalakshmi, Professor at Vignan Pharmacy College, among others.

The event was a huge success and raised awareness about the importance of cervical cancer prevention and treatment. The event organizers and guest speakers emphasized the need for regular screenings, early detection, and treatment to prevent cervical cancer from becoming a major health issue. The event also highlighted the importance of collaboration between healthcare professionals, policymakers, and communities to achieve the goal of cervical cancer elimination. Overall, the

event was a significant step towards empowering women and improving their health and wellbeing.

The event was also attended by Mr. Vidyadhar Garapati, a trustee of the TANA Foundation in the USA. He expressed his support for the cause and encouraged participants to continue raising awareness and supporting cancer prevention and treatment initiatives.

The event also featured several other speakers who spoke about their experiences with cancer and its treatment. The programme included a Q&A session, where attendees could ask questions to the medical professionals. The event concluded with result announcement by the adjudicator, a vote of thanks and a post-session survey to the participants, followed by the National Anthem. A press meet was also held to share the event's success and spread awareness about cervical cancer.

Cervical Cancer Training 5-6 August 2023



Training Session Report

Conducted by Dr. Harish N L - Consultant Surgical Oncologist and Robotic Surgeon

*Date: August 5th,2023

The training aimed to educate attendees, primarily students, as part of a "train the trainers" session on various aspects of cancer. The session covered essential topics such as cell biology, differences between normal and cancer cells, the genesis of cancer, its types, factors influencing cancer, a detailed exploration of breast cancer, and a separate discussion on cervical cancer awareness presented by Dr. Chinnababu.

Cancer is a complex and multifaceted disease that affects millions of lives worldwide. Understanding its basics, causes, and prevention is crucial. Dr. Harish N L, with over ten years of experience in surgical oncology, conducted a training session to equip attendees with the knowledge necessary to educate others about cancer and its various aspects. Dr. Harish N L, an accomplished Consultant Surgical Oncologist and Robotic Surgeon with a rich academic background and over ten years of experience, conducted an enlightening training session. This session was designed to equip medical professionals with advanced knowledge and techniques in the field of Surgical Oncology. Dr. Harish's qualifications, including MBBS, MS (Gen Surg), MRCS (A), MCh (Surg Onco-GCRI), FMAS, and SIF (Korea), make him a highly esteemed expert in the realm of cancer surgery and treatment.

Dr. Harish initiated the session by providing a comprehensive overview of Surgical Oncology, its significance in modern medicine, and its role in the multidisciplinary approach to cancer treatment. Then discussed by providing an overview of cells and their fundamental characteristics. He emphasized the key differences between normal cells and cancer cells, highlighting their abnormal growth, uncontrolled division, and ability to invade surrounding tissues.

The session delved into the mechanisms underlying cancer formation, discussing genetic mutations and factors that contribute to the development of cancer. He explained the various types of cancer, such as carcinoma, sarcoma, lymphoma, and leukemia, and elaborated on their distinct characteristics. The factors that influence the onset of cancer were discussed, including genetic predisposition, environmental factors (like smoking and exposure to carcinogens), and lifestyle choices (diet and physical activity). Dr. Harish emphasized the importance of early detection and prevention.

Dr. Harish provided a detailed description of breast cancer, discussing its origin in the breast tissue. He explained the difference between malignant (cancerous) and benign (non-cancerous) tumors, highlighting the potential dangers of malignancy and the need for accurate diagnosis. Malignant tumors are characterized by uncontrolled cell growth. Cancer cells divide rapidly and uncontrollably, leading to the formation of a mass of abnormal cells. Benign tumors, in contrast, exhibit controlled and regulated cell growth. The cells in benign tumors resemble normal cells and do not invade nearby tissues or spread to distant parts of the body. The methods for detecting breast cancer, such as mammograms, ultrasound, and biopsy, were explained in detail. Dr. Harish stressed the significance of regular screenings and early diagnosis in improving treatment outcomes.

The session covered various treatment options for breast cancer, including surgery, chemotherapy, radiation therapy, targeted therapy, and hormone therapy. He discussed how treatment plans are tailored to each patient's specific condition.

Dr. Harish also organized a Zoom meeting where Dr. Chinnababu provided an in-depth presentation on cervical cancer awareness. The topics covered included cervical cancer risk factors, symptoms, prevention strategies, and the importance of regular screenings.

The training session was aimed at students and was part of a "train the trainers" initiative. The goal was to equip future trainers with comprehensive knowledge about cancer, its types, detection, and

treatment. By sharing this knowledge, participants could raise awareness among a wider audience and contribute to early cancer detection and prevention efforts.

Dr. Harish N L's training session was highly informative, covering a wide range of topics related to cancer. Participants gained insights into the intricacies of cancer cells, their differences from normal cells, and the factors contributing to cancer development. The detailed overview of breast cancer, its detection, and treatment options provided valuable information for the participants. Additionally, the Zoom meeting on cervical cancer awareness enhanced the participants' understanding of different cancer types and prevention strategies. The session successfully empowered future trainers to educate others about cancer awareness and contribute to the fight against cancer.

This workshop was designed to enhance student knowledge about and to make them more aware of the practical application of the Preventing Sexual Harassment Act 2013. An introduction to sexual harassment at work and the methods by which an Internal Complaint Committee reacts to such complaints was provided at the

workshop. The session was addressed by Dr. Ch. Sudhakara Babu, Principal, JC College of Law, Guntur. All disciplines of students and staff attended the program. As an example of the type of acts that constitute sexual harassment of a woman at work, he provided some practical examples, which made the presentation quite interactive. Further, the esteemed speaker explained that under the prevention of sexual harassment Act 2013, aggrieved women included those employed either temporarily or permanently in the organized and unorganized sectors. The latter part of his presentation covered the process of redressing complaints of Sexual Harassment at Workplace by aggrieved women, as well as compounding of offence. The event concluded with a vote of thanks from Dr. P. Lakshmi Narayanamma, Associate Professor, Department of Management Studies towards the Guest.


This session creates awareness among students about sexual harassment, kinds of touch (safe unsafe) and different laws.

Key Points –

1. Vignan bus got stuck in Garapadu village for more than 1 hour due to unavailability of proper maps and routes.

2. Hence, visit to 3 schools in Pedakarupadu region could not be completed (1 in Kosuru, 1 in Malladi and 1 in Achampeta).
3. Achampeta ZPHS – the school suffers with frequent power cuts, maintenance of approach roads, water facility is not available and the local municipality is not collecting waste properly.
4. Pedapalem ZPHS – the class room infrastructure is very poor, bore well water supply not regular, compound wall not present.
5. Konuru ZPHS – lack of drinking water issue in the school and smart board with internet is required.
6. Bellamkonda ZPHS - they need proper roads to reach their school. Child marriages and alcoholism is huge issue in the village.
7. Chandrajupalem ZPHS – drinking water facility and funds for their new school building is necessary.
8. Hassanabad ZPHS – laboratory, library and smart boards facility need upgradation. Currently in very poor condition.
9. Nagavaram ZPHS – they need road facility to reach their school.
10. Pedakurupadu ZPHS – mid-day meal problem faced by the students.
11. Lingapuram ZPHS – drinking water problem faced by students.
12. Bayyavaram ZPHS – principal informed about rampant teen pregnancy and issue of teen marriages in the school. He said that parents are forging date of birth in identity documents by colluding with government officials. Requested that this issue be raised with MP and collector. Letter drafted and sent to Collector for taking necessary actions.

Key Points –

13. Kattamuru School – local area drainage very poor. Hygiene around school affected.
14. Rentapalla and Bhurugubanda Schools – Road facilities to reach school are non-existent causing serious issues for students to reach school.
15. Ganapavaram – No plates to eat mid-day meals. Require 650 plates for students to eat mid-day meals.
16. Kubadapuram – local roads and drainage are very poor.



17. SVSR ZPHS – Girls washroom cannot be used. Require bus for students to reach school.
18. Phanidem ZPHS – General school infrastructure is poor shape.
19. Garlapadu – lack of water in the area for drinking and other purposes.
20. Veenadevi – roads are in poor shape and local water problems for the villagers.
21. Dammalapadu – the school needs lights, fans and smartboards in the class rooms. The toilets are not functional.
