D.O.No.F.31-1/2013 (CU)

As you are aware, Central Government has been issuing various instructions from time to time for implementing the Reservation Policy of the Government; and UGC being an autonomous statutory body, under the administrative control of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, is under directions from the Government to strictly implement the said instructions by all grant-in-aid institutions.

In exercise of the powers vested under Section 20(1) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 the Government of India directs the UGC to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central Universities and those of Institutions Deemed to be Universities receiving aid from the public funds except in minority institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution.

To safeguard the interest of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Persons with Disability (PWD), the most deprived groups of the Indian Society, the constitution provides reservation in various services under Central and State Governments. The main objective is not to just provide jobs to increase their representation in services but to improve their social and educational status so that they can have their rightful place in the main-stream of the society. As per the constitutional provisions, the reservation for Scheduled Castes is 15%, 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, 27% for OBC and 3% for PWD.

The Commission has been contributing towards social equity and socio academic mobility of the under privileged groups of the society through various special schemes. The well being and the development of these groups are important indicators of the strength and success of a democratic society. Towards this, the Commission has been providing financial assistance to the universities and colleges under various schemes.

The Commission is pained to note that inspite of instructions issued by UGC for implementation of SC/ST/OBC/PWD reservation in admission and appointment; a number of complaints are being made by persons concerned to SC/ST/OBC/PWD category for irregularity in the implementation of reservation policy of Govt. of India in the university system.

In view of the monitoring of the complaints made by these groups for irregularity in implementation of reservation policy of Government of India, you are requested to intimate the details of complaints received during last two years from various quarters in the universities relating to irregularities in the implementation of reservation policy of Government of India (SC/ST/OBC/PWD) and action taken thereon by the university. The information may be furnished within 15 days of issue of this letter.

It is also requested you to create a OBC Cell as per instructions issued by DoPT vide letter No.43011/153/2010-Estt (Res.) dated 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2013 (copy enclosed) and intimate the action taken at the earliest.

Needless to mention, this information is required urgently and I request your kind cooperation and personal indulgence.

### **OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

Subject: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions.

In accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019, and the reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. This would not apply to the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of Article 30 of the Constitution of India.

2. The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in the OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and shall be subject to the following:

a) The reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in Central Educational Institutions, (as defined in clause (d) of section (2) of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006) from the academic year 2019-20 onwards.

b) The above reservation would not be applicable to the 8 institutions of excellence, research institutions, institutions of national & strategic importance as specified in the Schedule to The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006, as amended from time to time, and appended to this OM, and to the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution.

c) Every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority (as defined in clause (c) of section 2 of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006), increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of

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study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the

date of the coming into force of this O.M.

d) Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the appropriate authority is satisfied that for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of two years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Act; and then, the extent of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats made available to the Economically Weaker Sections for each academic session shall not reduce the number and the percentage of reservations provided for SC/ST/OBC categories.

e) The scheme for implementing the reservation for the EWS shall be displayed on the website of the institution as soon as possible, but no later than 31st March

2019.

- 3. The Chairman UGC, Chairman AICTE and Chairperson NCTE and the Bureau Heads of the Department of Higher Education in the Ministry of Human Resource Development responsible for management of the Institutions of National Importance are requested to ensure immediate compliance of this OM.
- 4. This issues with the approval of the Minister for Human Resource Development.



Chief Secretaries of all State Governments/UTs: with a request to give effect to the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 for all higher educational institutions funded/aided, directly or indirectly, by the State Government in such manner that the provision for reservation for EWS would become operational from the academic year 2019-20.



## RESERVATION POLICY

VFSTR strictly adhere to the reservation policy prescribed by Govt. of India and Andhra Pradesh State Government. In accordance with it 15% of the seats are reserved for scheduled castes (SC), 7.5% of seats are reserved for scheduled tribes (ST) and other 27% has been reserved for the other backward classes (OBC) comprising 49.5% reserved to OBC, SC & ST categories. In addition to this, 10% of the total intake in each programme will be reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) from the academic year 2019-20 and the total reservations for OBC, SC, ST and EWSs will be 59.5% of the permitted strength in each programme. In each of these categories horizontal reservation is given for special categories viz., Physically Handicapped – PH(3%), Children of Armed Forces Personnel – CAP (2%), National Cadet Corps – NCC (1%), Sports and Games (1/2%). In addition, a reservation of 33 1/3% of seats is in favour of women candidates in each category (OC/SC/ST/OBC). Reservation for women shall not be applicable if women candidates selected on merit in each category exceed 33 1/3%.

If there is any vacancy available in the seats that are allocated to fill via special categories of a particular reserved category, the opportunity will be passed to the candidates of that reserved category and then to the general candidates. All reservation category candidates are required to submit certificate in respect of their claim from the authorized officers as notified by the Government of India for the purpose from time to time.

In addition to that Reservation policy 10 seats are reserved under sports quota with 75% scholarship for 4 years of study who represented individual/track events at the state or university level. Another 10 seats are reserved with 50% scholarship for 4 years of study who represented individual/track events at the District level.

In each branch 60% of the seats are allotted for VSAT rankers, 20% of the seats to Inter merit/EAMCET rankers, 10% to JEE (Mains)/(Adv) rankers and remaining 10% are allocated in category B.

Relaxation in cut off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirements and reservation of one seat in merit quota for the wards of Kashmir migrants as per the direction of MHRD, Govt. of India.

There is no relaxation on any criteria specified, whether it is in passing of the exams or graduating a course. The candidates admitted through the reservation policy subjected to the same criteria as the general candidates in terms of fee structure and graduation policy.

Students can be admitted in VFSTR in any course mentioned above, if he/she meets the eligibility criteria and pay the prescribed fee.
