A Report on International Women's Day Celebrations at VFSTR, Guntur, A.P

The week-long celebrations of International Women's Day took place from 2nd to 7th March with great gusto and fervor at Vignan's Foundation for Science Technology & Research (VFSTR), Guntur, A.P.

2nd March Event - Workshop on Smart Technologies for Safer Cities (Application for Awareness on Women Safety Application, Safetipin)

An awareness program on women safety with the help of mobile application has been conducted under the auspices of Women Empowerment and Development Cell (WEDC) of the varsity under the stewardship of Dr.Usha Rani, Chairperson, WEDC, VFSTR.

The resource person, Ms. Ankita Kapoor, Project Associate of Active Learning Solutions Pvt. Ltd conducted the workshop .She spoke about the safety of women, problems regarding identifying the black spots in cities and how the Safetypin applications help to build safer cities for women. She gave a detailed overview of how this application works. Active Learning Solutions Pvt. Ltd has been working since 2013 and have collected data in over 40 cities in India and globally. The organoisation has helped strongly in building an evidence base using data. Safetipin has three apps for data collection on factors affecting women's safety at night. The first method My Safetipin app, is used to collect crowd sourced user audit data. Currently, it has more than 100,000 downloads of the app. "The Safetipin Nite app is used to capture photographs along with their location coordinates. Safetipin Site, the third app can collect customized data. Safetipin is the only system that collects night-time data and has evolved into an approach for data collection, analysis and representation. Safetipin is a global partner of UN Habitat's Global Network on Safer Cities. Safetipin has now collected data in more than 30 cities in India and outside. In Delhi, it has been used by women and girls in low income neighbourhoods to map their safety and advocate for changes. We have received several awards including the Dubai International Urban Best Practices Award, Global Urban Innovation of New Cities Foundation

Grand Celebrations of International Women's Day on 7th March2020

VFSTR has celebrated proudly the "International Women's day" at the Sangamam Seminar Hall on 7th March 2020. It celebrates the unique strength of women that is hard to find in the rest of human existence. Ms. Krishna Hasa Yellamancaili, Chief Digital Strategic Consultant, Adobe India and Ms. Purnima Mandava, CEO of WOW Fitness Centres, were the invited celebrities and guests for the event. Key university dignitaries, Vice-Chairman & Member of Parliament, Sri Krishna Devararyulu, Rector of VFSTR, Dr. Satya Prasad and Registrar Dr. C. Raghundhan also graced the event.

Initiating the event, the Chairperson of WEDC, VFSTR Dr. N. Chief Guest, Ms. Sri Krishna Hasa briefed the student and faculty gathering on the advances in industry and plethora of opportunities open to them in the technical and business world. She asked them to become savvy in the digital applications to be able to take their careers to the next level. Guest of Honour, Ms. Purnima Mandava advised students not to blindly ape the western culture but draw strength from their own culture. Those who are rooted in their culture will be more confident and happy in the modern stress ridden world. She added that the answer is not for men and women to try to be alike. All men and women must be themselves, realizing that God has given each of us unique abilities with which to pursue our goals, and that our primary responsibility is to take full advantage of those abilities. She reminded that man and woman should play complementary roles without competing with each other. Women have greater empathy. Men are physically more robust and usually more aggressive and externally oriented. "Let's celebrate the incredible strength of women to strengthen the foundation of the society," she concluded. Speaking on the occasion, Registrar, Cmde. Dr. M.S Ragunathan lauded the Women Empowerment and Development Cell of VFSTR which celebrates every function in an effective and grand way.

The speeches by the guests were followed by prize distribution to the winners of various competitions in the sports, cultural and creative categories.
